

Leadership New Mexico Local Government Leadership Program



THE CONCEPT

The Local Government Leadership Program is an educational partnership between New Mexico Counties, New Mexico Municipal League, New Mexico School Boards Association, and Leadership New Mexico. The program offers local government officials a unique educational experience to develop and enhance their leadership capacities and provide them with the knowledge necessary to undertake their civic responsibilities with a passion for effective and ethical public service.



THE PROGRAM

The program consists of two 2-1/2 day program sessions. The curriculum is modeled after the Leadership New Mexico Core Program and offers an opportunity to explore critical issues facing New Mexico and participate in skill-building workshops. Topics for the program include:

- History and Demographics of New Mexico
- Economic Development
- Education
- Environment and Natural Resources
- Health and Human Services
- Crime and Justice
- Personal Leadership Skill-Building Workshops



Each session features speakers who are acknowledged leaders in their specific fields and allows participants the opportunity to engage in discussion with them. The program offers the opportunity for inquiry, analysis, and the development of solutions to the most pressing issues facing our communities and state.

TUITION

A limited number of scholarships are available for those requiring financial assistance. A request for scholarship assistance does not affect selection into the program. Scholarship priority will go to applicants from our most rural counties (population 15,000 or less).
